

Footpath 37 - July 2012 Island Lane to Mill Lane

If you have ever walked all or part of this route and wish to ensure this route is open for the public to walk please fill in an ECC evidence form, draw the route you walked on a map and hand the completed form into Frinton and Walton Town Council (FWTC) at the triangle in Frinton.

Frinton and Walton Town Council will act as collection point for evidence forms up until the end of July 2012 and they will actually make the application to Essex County Council.

There has recently been a similar exercise regarding the alleyway that has been blocked up next to the shop where King's the greengrocers used to be. ECC were very fussy about the type of map used and how it was filled in. It is important to draw the path you walked with a thin red pen.

Sometimes some people feel it is not possible for local people to persuade a County Council to make a change such as creating a new public footpath. This is not true. There is a recent example of a footpath being created in Walton-on-the-Naze.

A few years ago there was a successful campaign to make the stretch of seawall from Foundry Creek to North Street, Walton a public footpath.

Remember you have to submit your form before the end of July.

If you have only walked part of this footpath your evidence will still help, just mark the section of the footpath you have walked.
